

THE MOUNT VERNON COMMUNITY TRUST

1966

Dear Fellow Citizens of the Knox County Area:

This, the twenty-second Annual Report of your Community Trust, is evidence of the importance and value of such a philanthropic foundation in this area.

During 1966 new gifts to the Community Trust principal amounted to \$182,168.21. Of this amount, \$96,024.93 was specifically designated for the purchase of property as a site for the new Mount Vernon Nazarene College. This project was the highlight of our activities during 1966 and is a typical example of the action the Community Trust renders.

When it became known through the Mount Vernon Area Chamber of Commerce that the Nazarene Church was looking for a site in central Ohio to establish a new liberal arts college, a committee headed by Mr. Ralph Boyer was organized to solicit contributions to a fund for the purchase of approximately 200 acres of the Lakeholm Farm to be given as the site for the new college.

Your Community Trust was able to serve as the vehicle to receive these gifts from the citizens of our area and to disburse them at the appropriate time in payment for the property. In addition, the Distribution Committee of the Community Trust authorized a payment of \$15,000.00 from unrestricted funds to the College site fund.

The \$96,024.93 paid in by individuals and corporations during 1966 will no doubt be disbursed in 1967, along with other amounts that will be received, to apply on the purchase price of the Lakeholm property. Since some of the pledges were spread over a two or three year period the Trust may be called

upon to advance funds against unpaid pledges in order to complete the purchase.

A total of \$175,121.98 was disbursed from the Trust during the year as shown by the report. The major items being for the benefit of the Y. M. C. A. building fund, the Nazarene College site fund, and payment of a note given for the purchase of the City Building site.

The coming year will not only call for the disbursement of all of the Nazarene College site fund but also \$35,000.00 to the Y. M. C. A. building fund and the final payment of \$12,560.00, plus interest, for the City Building site.

Unrestricted gifts and gifts for specific philanthropic purposes received over the years and grants authorized by the Distribution Committee from the Trust are examples of how the Trust operates for the benefit of the entire area. New assets are always needed in order for the Trust to grow and continue to serve effectively.

Our Trustees or any member of the Distribution Committee will always be pleased to discuss plans you may have to give to the Mount Vernon Community Trust. Such gifts will have lasting benefits. They may be made in cash or property of any kind. Outright gifts may be made during lifetime as well as gifts under Wills. See the back cover page for suggested Forms of Bequest under a Will.

Your suggestions and questions are welcome and your favorable consideration of a gift to the Trust will be given careful attention.
