THE MOUNT VERNON COMMUNITY TRUST

What it is

It is a charitable fund made up of numerous gifts placed with the Trustee at different times by individuals, families, corporations, and service groups to serve permanently the educational, charitable, health, and welfare needs of the community.

How it works

These gifts are in the keeping of the Trustee Bank, (The First-Knox National Bank), which invests them for safety of principal and income and certifies quarterly to the Distribution Committee the amount available for distribution as directed by the donors. In the absence of such direction, the amounts available are disbursed at the discretion of the Committee in accordance with the purpose of the Trust.

Why it works

Since the Cleveland Foundation was established in 1914, many such charitable trusts have proven their value in communities throughout the country. The plan is attractive to donors since gifts of property, such as stocks and bonds, are accepted at full market value on date of transfer, free of any capital gains or federal income taxes. The plan is flexible so that a donor can be certain his fund will be used effectively, even though conditions change. If a cause or purpose selected by the donor becomes obsolete, ceases to exist, merges with others, or no longer requires financial aid, the fund is then used for the support of activities in a field similar to the one mentioned by the donor.

Who it works for . . .

It works for the donor by safe-guarding the principal and disbursing the income of this gift long after his decease and by winning for him a certain immortality in the memory of friends, neighbors, and specific beneficiaries.

It works for the people of the community, all of whom are benefited by gifts for civic improvements.

Gifts can be channeled through the Trust to educational, charitable, and benevolent organizations not only throughout the United States but anywhere in the world.

Forward -

This twenty-ninth annual report of The Mount Vernon Community Trust reflects new gifts of \$29,395.49 during the vear 1973. Of this amount \$9,913.58 came from ten individuals, \$11,500.00 from a corporation, \$2,971.91 from an estate and \$10.00 from a club. Fifty-nine gifts made up the late Charles M. Zelkowitz Memorial Fund of \$5,000.00.

Mr. Zelkowitz had been a prominent lawyer in Mount Vernon for forty-two years. He wrote the Resolution and Declaration of Trust which created The Mount Vernon Community Trust on December 18, 1944. He was a staunch advocate of the Trust and served as Secretary of the Distribution Committee until his death on August 9, 1973. His support, counsel, time and talent, freely given, has contributed much to the progress of the Trust.

Interest and dividends on investments held in the Trust during the year came to \$60,980.98 and net gain from security transactions amounted to \$7,872.26 for total income of \$68,853.24.

Principal paid out as authorized by the Distribution Committee and in accordance with the wishes of the donors amounted to \$11,988.38 and from income and capital gains \$19,113.96. Fifty-four separate payments to beneficiaries make up these amounts as detailed in the report. Other payments were made as authorized by the Committee from income on unrestricted funds for a total of \$9,261.26. Beneficiaries were the Public Square, Memorial Theater, Knox County Chapter of The American Red Cross and Central Ohio Red Cross Blood Center.

New gifts, large, medium and small, from living donors, corporations, and from bequests under wills always will be welcomed to enable the Trust to grow and render greater service. Attorneys can be helpful in preparing bequests under wills. Just let them know that you wish to leave a bequest to The Mount Vernon Community Trust.

Members of the Distribution Committee and the Trustee Bank welcome inquiries about the Trust and assure careful attention to gifts during lifetime or bequests under wills.
