



THE MOUNT VERNON COMMUNITY TRUST

What it is....

It is a charitable fund made up of numerous gifts placed with the Trustee at different times by individuals, families, corporations, and service groups to serve permanently the educational, charitable, health, and welfare needs of the community.

How it works

These gifts are in the keeping of the Trustee Bank, (The First-Knox National Bank), which invests them for safety of principal and income and certifies quarterly to the Distribution Committee the amount available for distribution as directed by the donors. In the absence of such direction, the amounts available are disbursed at the discretion of the Committee in accordance with the purpose of the Trust.

Why it works....

Since the Cleveland Foundation was established in 1914, many such charitable trusts have proven their value in communities throughout the country. The plan is attractive to donors since gifts of property, such as stocks and bonds, are accepted at full market value on date of transfer, free of any capital gains or federal income taxes. The plan is flexible so that a donor can be certain his fund will be used effectively, eventhough conditions change. If a cause or purpose selected by the donor becomes obsolete, ceases to exist, merges with others, or no longer requires financial aid, the fund is then used for the support of activities in a field similar to the one mentioned by the donor.

Who it works for

It works for the donor by safe-guarding the principal and disbursing the income of this gift long after his decease and by winning for him a certain immortality in the memory of friends, neighbors, and specific beneficiaries.

It works for the people of the community, all of whom are benefited by gifts for civic improvements.

Gifts can be channeled through the Trust to educational, charitable, and benevolent organizations not only throughout the United States but anywhere in the world.

FORWARD

A summary of this thirty-third annual report of the Mount Vernon Community Trust reflects four new gifts received during the year amounting to \$16,805.00. Of this amount \$10,000.00 came as a bequest in the will of Louise Meltzer, \$1,000.00 as an additional gift to the Sanderson-Salisbury Memorial Fund, \$5,170.00 to the Memorial Fund of the late John W. Rudin, Sr., who was one of the original organizers of the Trust, an additional gift from H. Grant Heckler of \$500.00 and additional miscellaneous gifts of \$135.00 to the Dr. Thomas L. Bogardus Memorial Fund.

Income from interest and dividends on investments amounted to \$120,520.00, an increase of \$22,611.00 over the prior year, principally as a result of substantial bequests and gifts during the 1976 year. From this income \$45,407.00 was disbursed under authority of the Distribution Committee in accordance with suggestions of donors and \$38,500.00 in grants were authorized by the Committee. Expenses, including extra legal and other fees caused by changes in the laws and regulations governing trusts and foundations, amounted to \$14,462.00. This resulted in total disbursements of \$98,369.00 and a carry over of \$22,223.00 of unexpended income to apply on commitments already authorized for next year.

Some forty-three disbursements were made for public, educational, charitable and benevolent causes during the year. There are over 100 funds carried on the books of the Trustee ranging in amounts up to approximately \$200,000.00. A fund may be started and added to at any time. The fund may be for general or specific purposes and may be in your name, the name of someone else or as a memorial fund. The growth and extent of the usefullness of the Trust is dependent on the participation of the people of the community. Comments and inquiries are always appreciated and invited.
