# THE MOUNT VERNON COMMUNITY TRUST

#### WHAT IT IS...

It is a charitable fund made up of numerous gifts placed with the Trustee at different times by individuals, families, corporations, and service groups to serve permanently the educational, charitable, health, and welfare needs of the community.

#### **HOW IT WORKS...**

These gifts are in the keeping of the Trustee Bank, (The First-Knox National Bank), which invests them for safety of principal and income and certifies quarterly to the Distribution Committee the amount available for distribution as directed by the donors. In the absence of such direction, the amounts available are disbursed at the discretion of the Committee in accordance with the purpose of the Trust.

#### WHY IT WORKS...

Since the Cleveland Foundation was established in 1914, many such charitable trusts have proven their value in communities throughout the country. The plan is attractive to donors since gifts of property, such as stocks and bonds, are accepted at full market value on date of transfer, free of any capital gains or federal income taxes. The plan is flexible so that a donor can be certain his fund will be used effectively, even though conditions change. If a cause or purpose selected by the donor becomes obsolete, ceases to exist, merges with others, or no longer requires financial aid, the fund is then used for the support of activities in a field similar to the one mentioned by the donor.

#### WHO IT WORKS FOR...

It works for the donor by safe-guarding the principal and disbursing the income of this gift long after his decease and by winning for him a certain immortality in the memory of friends, neighbors, and specific beneficiaries.

It works for the people of the community, all of whom are benefited by gifts for civic improvements.

Gifts can be channeled through the Trust to educational, charitable, and benevolent organizations not only throughout the United States but anywhere in the world.

## **FOREWORD**

The year 1985 has been one of new heights for The Mount Vernon Community Trust — a record \$5,494,743 in principal and income at year end, an increase of 34 percent over the preceding year; a record in new gifts to the Trust; a record year of grants made and authorized.

The Trust, established in 1944, reached its first one million dollars of principal in 1971 and its second million in 1983, and passed the four million dollar mark in 1984. In 1985 some major gifts listed elsewhere in this report pushed us over the five million dollar mark. Such gifts included \$606,023 from a trust established in 1929 by B. B. Williams, and which is now being distributed. There was also an additional \$88,500 from the estate of Belle Shrontz, and \$47,356 from the R. B. Kincaid Estate. New principal acquired in 1985 totaled \$828,880.

Contributions, large and small, to the Trust provide income from which we can make more grants to more projects. Grants in 1985 from our Scholarship Program exceeded \$125,000. The Distribution Committee authorized \$100,000, to be paid over a three-year period, for purchase of a city office building by Mount Vernon. The Trust gave financial aid in providing a new home for New Directions, aided Danville Boosters in building a new field house, authorized aid in construction of a new Knox County Agricultural Museum, and gave the final push to enable United Way to reach its campaign goal. The many gifts from designated funds to churches, schools, Red Cross, YMCA, and other organizations are listed in this report.

We see 1986 as another year of growth, and we remind all citizens of Knox County their gifts will enable the Trust to continue to make it possible to meet community needs through the years ahead.

It should also be noted that once again the Trust Department of The First-Knox National Bank, our trustee-bank, has given careful and conservative attention to the expenses of operating the Trust. Expenses in 1985 amounted to \$27,661, or one half of one percent of the year-end principal and income.
